- Talk about why these things had an impact and what difference these points make.
- Why is it important to see what God will do at the end of all things?
- How does this vision of the end offer hope in the midst of suffering?
- How does this show us what God is doing in the world, even in the midst of suffering?
- What are you facing now that calls for hope?
